RE: Notice of Violation

Dear Mr. Brooks:

Enclosed you will find a Notice of Violation (NOV) issued to BP America Production Company by the Department of Environmental Quality, Air Quality Division, for failing to comply with the permit requirement for routing vapors to the combustor for the Cabrito 9-25 PAD located in Sublette County, Wyoming. This violation of permit MD-1409 was observed by Ms. Jennifer Frazier on March 24, 2008.

As the Department and this Division consider the failure to comply with air quality permit conditions to be a serious matter, I am considering recommending the Department refer this violation to the State Attorney General's office requesting a suit be filed in District Court to recover appropriate penalties. If you would like to discuss settlement of this Notice of Violation prior to referral to the Attorney General's office, please contact Ms. Karen Godman, Air Quality Compliance Program Principal, at 307-777-3774 no later than ten (10) days after receipt of this letter.

NOTICE OF VIOLATION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT:

1. The Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Air Quality, has found BP America Production Company, to be in violation of permit MD-1409 issued in accordance with W.S. 35-11-801 of the Wyoming Environmental Quality Act and Chapter 6, Section 2 of the Wyoming Air Quality Standards and Regulations at the Cabrito 9-25 PAD located in Sublette County, Wyoming.

2. W.S. 35-11-801(a) states, "In granting permits, the Director may impose such conditions as may be necessary to accomplish the purpose of this act which are not inconsistent with the existing rules, regulations and standards."

3. Chapter 6, Section 2 of the Wyoming Air Quality Standards and Regulations prescribes the applicability and procedures for issuing permits to sources under Wyoming's construction and modification permitting program.

4. Permit MD-1409 was issued to BP America Production Company on July 25, 2006. Permit MD-1409 dictates control of vent vapors from tanks through conditions 13 & 14 as follows:

Condition 13(A.) states:

"Upon the First Date of Production of an additional well at the Cabrito 9-25 PAD facility or upon the date production associated with a well from a separate location is tied into the Cabrito 9-25 PAD facility, controls for emissions from all existing and new hydrocarbon liquid storage tanks and pressure vessels (flashing/standing/working/breathing losses and any separator flash gas not collected for sales) shall be installed and operational. Emission control systems or devices installed under this condition shall be designed and operated to reduce the mass content of VOCs in the gases vented to the device by at least ninety-eight percent (98%) by weight, and shall meet the requirements of the Chapter 6, Section 2 Oil and Gas Production Facilities Permitting Guidance."

Condition 13(B.) states:

"Upon the First Date of Production of an additional well at the Cabrito 9-25 PAD facility or upon the date production associated with a well from a separate location is tied into the Cabrito 9-25 PAD facility, controls for emissions from all existing and new dehydration

units, including the reboiler still vents and the vents from the GCG separators (flash tanks), if present, shall be installed and operational. Emission control systems or devices installed under this condition shall be designed and operated to reduce the mass content of total HAPs in the gases vented to the device by at least ninety-five percent (95%) by weight, and shall meet the requirements of the C6 S2 Guidance.”

Condition 14 states:

“Emission control devices installed under condition thirteen (13), shall be maintained and operated during all periods of active well site operation such that each remains effective as a viable emissions control device. Records shall be maintained noting dates and durations of times during active well site operation when any emission control device is not operational.”


5. On March 24, 2008, Ms. Jennifer Frazier, Air Quality Division Engineer/Inspector, observed continuous significant amounts of vapors venting from two thief hatches and the dehydration unit. Venting vapors from thief hatches and the dehydration unit and not routing vapors from the condensate tanks and the dehydration unit to the combustion device is a violation of conditions 13 & 14 of permit MD-1409.


6. Said violation consists of venting vapors from thief hatches and the dehydration unit and not routing vapors from the condensate tanks and the dehydration unit to the combustion device.

7. Under W.S. 35-11-901(a), any person who violates any provision of Article 2 of [the Environmental Quality Act] ... or any rule, regulation, standard or permit adopted pursuant to those provisions, or who violates any determination or order of the council pursuant to Article 2 of [the Environmental Quality Act] ... is subject to a penalty not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for each violation for each day during which the violation continues, a temporary or permanent injunction, or both a penalty and an injunction.

8. This notice is being sent to you pursuant to W.S. 35-11-701(c), which requires that, in any case of the failure to correct or remedy an alleged violation, the Director of the Department of Environmental Quality shall cause a written notice to be issued and served upon the person alleged to be responsible.
