Re: Notice of Violation

Dear Mr. Pearce:

Enclosed you will find a Notice of Violation (NOV) issued to FMC Wyoming Corporation for exceeding permitted particulate limits for the Mono-5 gas-fired calciner in violation of condition 3 of permit OP-265 at the Westvaco Facility located in Sweetwater County, Wyoming. This is a direct violation of condition 3 of permit OP-265.

As the Department and this Division consider the failure to comply with air quality permit conditions to be a serious matter, I am recommending the Department refer this violation to the State Attorney General's office requesting a suit be filed in District Court to recover appropriate penalties.

NOTICE OF VIOLATION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT:

1. The Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Air Quality, has found FMC Wyoming Corporation to be in violation of permit OP-265 issued in accordance with W.S. 35-11-801 of the Wyoming Environmental Quality Act and Chapter 6, Section 2 of the Wyoming Air Quality Standards and Regulations in the operation of the Westvaco Facility located in Sweetwater County, Wyoming.

2. W.S. 35-11-801(a) states, "In granting permits, the director may impose such conditions as may be necessary to accomplish the purpose of this act which are not inconsistent with the existing rules, regulations and standards."

3. Chapter 6, Section 2 of the Wyoming Air Quality Standards and Regulations prescribes the applicability and procedures for issuing permits to sources under Wyoming's construction and modification permitting program.

4. Permit OP-265 was issued to FMC Wyoming Corporation on October 25, 1996. Condition 3 requires that mass emission rates for all particulate sources to include the Mono-5 gas-fired calciner be limited to rates shown in Table 1. Table 1 limits the Mono-5 to 53.0 pph of particulate.

5. Stack testing conducted October 4, 2011 for the Mono-5 gas-fired calciner showed a three run average of 55.3 pph for particulate emissions (104.3% of the 53.0 pph limit). Failure to meet emission limits for particulate for the Mono-5 calciner constitutes a violation of condition 3 of permit OP-265.

6. Said violation consists of failing to meet particulate emission limits as required in permit OP-265. This constitutes a violation of permit condition 3 of permit OP-265.


7. Under W.S. 35-11-901(a), any person who violates any provision of Article 2 of [the Environmental Quality Act] ... or any rule, regulation, standard or permit adopted pursuant to those provisions, or who violates any determination or order of the council pursuant to Article 2 of [the Environmental Quality Act] ... is subject to a penalty not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for each violation for each day during which the violation continues, a temporary or permanent injunction, or both a penalty and an injunction.

8. This notice is being sent to you pursuant to W.S. 35-11-701(c), which requires that, in any case of failure to correct or remedy an alleged violation, the Director of the Department of Environmental Quality shall cause a written notice to be issued and served upon the person alleged to be responsible.
