RE: Notice of Violation

Dear Mr. Baber:

Enclosed you will find a Notice of Violation (NOV) issued to Devon Energy Production Company, L.P. by the Department of Environmental Quality, Air Quality Division, for failing to comply with permit requirements for routing vapors to the emission control devices and venting vapors at the Creston Nose 9A-9-18-92 PAD facility located in Carbon County, Wyoming. These are violations of permit CT-12493. These violations were observed by Mr. Travis Guthrie on June 12, 2014.

As the Department and this Division consider the failure to comply with air quality permit conditions to be a serious matter, I am considering recommending the Department refer this violation to the State Attorney General's office requesting a suit be filed in District Court to recover appropriate penalties. **NOTICE OF VIOLATION**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT:**

1. The Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Air Quality, has found Devon Energy Production Company, L.P., to be in violation of permit CT-12493. This permit was issued in accordance with W.S. 35-11-801 of the Wyoming Environmental Quality Act and Chapter 6, Section 2 of the Wyoming Air Quality Standards and Regulations for the Creston Nose 9A-9-18-92 PAD production facility located in Carbon County, Wyoming.

2. W.S. 35-11-801(a) states, "In granting permits, the Director may impose such conditions as may be necessary to accomplish the purpose of this act which are not inconsistent with the existing rules, regulations and standards."

3. Chapter 6, Section 2 of the Wyoming Air Quality Standards and Regulations prescribes the applicability and procedures for issuing permits to sources under Wyoming's construction and modification permitting program.

4. Permit CT-12493 was issued to Devon Energy Production Company on January 31, 2012 for the Creston Nose 9A-9-18-92 PAD production facility. Condition 16 requires control of emissions as follows:

"Emission control equipment, including the VOC and HAP emission control system or device, all vent lines, connections, fittings, valves, relief valves, hatches or any other appurtenance employed to contain and collect vapors and transport them to the emission control system or device, shall be maintained and operated during any time the wells are producing such that the emissions are controlled at all times..."

5. On June 12, 2014, Mr. Travis Guthrie, Air Quality Division Engineer/Inspector, observed that vapors were venting from the water tank and condensate tank Enardo valves.

6. Said violations consist of venting vapors and not routing vapors to the emission control devices at the Creston Nose 9A-9-18-92 PAD facility located in Carbon, Wyoming. Venting vapors and not routing vapors to the emission control devices are violations of condition 16 of permit CT-12493.

7. Under W.S. 35-11-901(a), any person who violates any provision of Article 2 of [the Environmental Quality Act] ... or any rule, regulation, standard or permit adopted pursuant to those provisions, or who violates any determination or order of the council pursuant to Article 2 of [the Environmental Quality Act] ... is subject to a penalty not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for each violation for each day during which the violation continues, a temporary or permanent injunction, or both a penalty and an injunction.

8. This notice is being sent to you pursuant to W.S. 35-11-701(c), which requires that, in any case of the failure to correct or remedy an alleged violation, the Director of the Department of Environmental Quality shall cause a written notice to be issued and served upon the person alleged to be responsible.
