

In accordance with Chapter 6, Section 2(m) of the Wyoming Air Quality Standards and Regulations, notice is hereby given that the State of Wyoming, Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Air Quality, proposes to approve a request by Linn Operating, Inc. to construct a new gas/condensate production facility, known as the Stud Horse Butte 10E PAD, consisting of the Stud Horse Butte 10 D5 and 10 E5 wells, with two reboiler overheads condensers and two smokeless combustion devices to control volatile organic compound and hazardous air pollutant emissions associated with the dehydration units, condensate tank, active produced water tank, low-pressure separators and pneumatic pumps, located in the SW1/4NW1/4 of Section 10, T29N, R108W, approximately sixteen (16) miles southwest of Big Piney, in Sublette County, Wyoming. A Chapter 6, Section 2(c)(ii) demonstration in accordance with the Division's Interim Policy has been conducted. Emission offset requirements, if applicable, have been applied to this permitting action at a ratio of 1.5:1.0 for VOCs and 1.1:1.0 for NOx. Permitting actions to date have resulted in a decrease in actual VOC emissions of 169.2 TPY and a decrease in actual NOx emissions of 178.1 tpy. Therefore, Linn Operating has met the offset requirements for VOCs and NOx.
