AFFIDAVIT OF JOSEPH H. TIPPETTS

I, Joseph H Tippetts, being first duly sworn upon my oath, being of legal age, and having personal knowledge of the matters asserted herein, and being otherwise competent to testify, do state as follows:

1. I am the Associate General Counsel for the Applicant Power Company of Wyoming LLC (“PCW”), located in Denver, Colorado.
2. PCW proposes to construct and operate the Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project (“CCSM Project”) located in Carbon County, Wyoming.
3. On January 21, 2012, PCW intends to file an application for a permit from the Wyoming Industrial Siting Council to construct, operate and maintain the CCSM Project, pursuant to W.S. 35-12-106 and W.S. 35-12-109.
4. Pursuant to W.S. 35-12-105(f) and the *Rules and Regulations of the Industrial Siting Council*, Chapter 1, Rule 10(g), PCW commissioned J. Mark Smith & Associates, Inc. to conduct a title search and prepare a report identifying all record owners of mineral rights located on or under the lands where the proposed CCSM Project will be constructed. *See Report of*

Mineral Title Search, Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project, dated July 13, 2012, attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** (“Landman Report”). The Landman Report identifies 158 individual mineral owners. The Landman Report also details the steps taken and the resources expended to conduct this mineral title search. Both the Carbon County real property records and the Bureau of Land Management federal land records were searched with respect to an area comprising approximately 320,000 acres. In total, this search required eight landmen working full time and 30 days to complete at a projected total cost of about \$80,000.

5. PCW prepared the notice to mineral owners attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** (the “Notice to Mineral Owners”). As required by Rule 10(g), the Notice to Mineral Owners includes a statement of PCW’s intention to construct the CCSM Project, features of the project, a legal description of the boundaries of the project, locations where the application may be examined and persons to contact for additional information. The map referenced in the Notice to Mineral Owners as available on PCW’s website is also attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**.

6. On or about July 16, 2012, PCW mailed a Notice to Mineral Owners by first class mail to all record owners of mineral rights identified in the Landman Report. The mailing list for such owners of mineral rights (158 individual entries) is attached hereto as **Exhibit 3**. Proof of such mailing by the United States Postal Service (First Class Mail) is attached hereto as **Exhibit 4**.

7. Pursuant to Rule 10(g), PCW has caused to be published a notice to mineral owners of the proposed CCSM Project in the *Rawlins Daily Times* on July 13, 2012 and July 14, 2012 and in the *Saratoga Sun* on July 18, 2012. Affidavits of Publication from those newspapers are attached hereto as **Exhibit 5**.

8. Pursuant to the *Rules and Regulations of the Industrial Siting Council*, Chapter 1, Rules 5(b) and 9(l), PCW prepared the notice to local governments attached hereto as **Exhibit 6** (the “Notice to Local Governments”). The Notice to Local Governments includes a description of the proposed CCSM Project, its location, the expected construction period, the number of construction workers, transportation routes for construction materials, the anticipated economic benefits of the project, and offers methods to comments to PCW. The Notice to Local Governments also invites representatives of the local governments to attend scheduled informational meetings hosted by PCW regarding the CCSM Project.


9. Pursuant to Rule 5(b), on or about August 29, 2012, PCW mailed a Notice to Local Governments by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the local governmental entities set forth on **Exhibit 7**. On or about August 29, 2012, PCW mailed a Notice to Local Governments by regular mail to the governmental entities set forth on **Exhibit 8**, as recommended by the Industrial Siting Division. Finally, on or about September 26, 2012, PCW mailed a Notice to Local Governments by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the local school districts set forth on **Exhibit 9**.

10. Pursuant to Rule 5(b), PCW hosted informational meetings for local governmental entities and the general public at the following times and locations: September 9, 2012, 4 pm – 7 pm, Little Snake River Valley Community Center, Baggs, Wyoming; September 10, 2012, 10 am – 2 pm Medicine Bow Community Hall, Medicine Bow, Wyoming; September 10, 2012, 4 pm – 7 pm, Hilton Garden Inn, Laramie, Wyoming; September 18, 2012, 4:30 pm – 7:30 pm, The Depot, Rawlins, Wyoming (public B-B-Q); September 19, 2012, 4:30 pm – 7:30 pm, Platte Valley Community Center, Saratoga, Wyoming (public B-B-Q); September 24, 2012, 4 pm – 7 pm, Homewood Suites, Rock Springs, Wyoming; and

September 25, 2012, Hilton Garden Inn, Casper, Wyoming. PCW representatives were present at all such informational meetings to provide information about the CCSM Project, answer questions and receive feedback from the public. In advance of the informational meetings, PCW ran various advertisements in the *Rawlins Daily Times*, *Saratoga Sun* and *Snake River Press* to notify the public of the informational meetings. **Exhibit 10** attached hereto contains copies of such advertisements, sign-in sheets for each informational meeting, and the 13 formal comments received by the public.

Mrs. Cummins and Mr. Tippetts:

As you requested, this report summarizes the mineral title work performed by J. Mark Smith & Associates, Inc. in connection with the Chokeycherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project. Our task was to identify all record owners of fee, leasehold and mining claim interests in the mineral estate in the approximately 210,000 acre project area in Carbon County, Wyoming. We understand that you will present this report as part of your application for a permit for the project from Carbon County and from the Wyoming Industrial Siting Council.

Timeline

J. Mark Smith & Associates, Inc. accepted the mineral title search project on June 9, 2012. The project completion and transmittal date was set as July 9, 2012. Given the size and scope of the work to be performed (e.g., research mineral title in an approximately 210,000 acre area), it was necessary to employ extraordinary efforts to accommodate the deadline.

Assets and Division of Labor

J. Mark Smith & Associates, Inc. utilized a total of eight independent landmen from four different states to complete the project. The nature of the mineral title ownership and the location of the public records required us to divide our efforts between reviewing public records in Rawlins, Carbon County, Wyoming and reviewing State and Federal public records in Cheyenne Wyoming. We utilized four brokers in Rawlins and four brokers in Cheyenne. Nearly all eight landmen worked full time for the entire 30 day work period to accomplish the task by the deadline.

Work Performed

J. Mark Smith & Associates, Inc. performed a patent-to-present search of the tract indices available in the Carbon County Clerk and Recorder's Office and a search of the mineral title records of the Bureau of Land Management and the State of Wyoming. We performed this search on all tracts in the approximately 210,000 acre "Mineral Title Search Area" you provided to us in the map attached to this report, except with respect to those tracts where you have already obtained mineral title ownership reports. You instructed us to run those tracts forward from the date of the provided mineral title ownership reports. We noted and included any changes in title and incorporated the same in our report. You instructed us to confine our title search to only those owners of mineral rights whose identity and addresses are readily obtainable from publicly available documents.



Project Completion and Deliverables


On July 6, 2012, J. Mark Smith & Associates, Inc. transmitted an Excel file identifying the owners of mineral rights in the Mineral Title Search Area that were discovered in the public records of Carbon County, Wyoming and the mineral title records of the Bureau of Land Management and the State of Wyoming. Included in the Excel file were the owner's name, address (if available), the type of mineral interest held, and a legal description of the land where the mineral interest lies. Our search produced over a thousand mineral interest entries by land tract with a total of 158 mineral owners of record.



Notice to Owners of Mineral Rights Within the Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project

July 9, 2012

Dear Owner of Mineral Rights:

Public real property records identify you as an owner of mineral rights located within the boundary of the proposed Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project, which is owned and developed by Power Company of Wyoming LLC. State law and Carbon County permit regulations require PCW to notify you about this project.

The Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project is an approximately 2,500-megawatt (1,000 turbines) wind energy generation project to be built on a ranch south of Rawlins and Sinclair and northwest of Saratoga. This ranch is privately owned and operated by The Overland Trail Cattle Company LLC.

Because of each turbine's compact footprint, the wind energy project will permanently use less than 2,000 acres of the 320,000-acre Overland Trail Cattle Company ranch. A legal description of the project's boundary is included with this notice.

The likely access points that PCW will use for project construction and operation are:

1. Just south of Sinclair at I-80 Exit 221, the CIG Plant Road (northern access into the project).

2. About 17 miles south of Rawlins on County Road 401 (western and southern access into the project).

The wind project has been extensively reviewed at a federal level via an Environmental Impact Statement prepared by the U.S. Bureau of Land Management/Rawlins Field Office. In addition, PCW will apply for a permit from the Wyoming Industrial Siting Division to construct and operate the wind project. That application should be available for examination at the Division and at the Carbon County Library and the Wyoming State Library in November or December of this year.







Power Company of Wyoming LLC (PCW) is developing the Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project (Project) located in Carbon County, Wyoming. PCW is in the process of obtaining a permit from the Wyoming Industrial Siting Division (ISD) to construct, operate and decommission the Project. In connection with this process, the ISD has identified a geographical area called the "study area," which includes local governments located in the vicinity of the Project. Your local government lies within this study area. Therefore, PCW is providing this informational notice to you, as required by the ISD rules.

This letter provides information about the Project's basic features; transportation to and from the Project; construction schedule and work force; the Project's many benefits; and the various informational meetings that PCW will host in the coming weeks where you can obtain more information and provide comments about the Project.

The Project

The Project is an approximately 2,500 megawatt (1,000 turbines) wind energy generation facility to be built on a 320,000-acre ranch south of Rawlins and Sinclair and northwest of Saratoga (the Ranch). The Ranch is privately owned and operated by The Overland Trail Cattle Company LLC. A map of the Project is enclosed with this notice that shows the Project's location, boundary and features.

Because of each wind turbine's compact footprint, the Project will permanently use less than 2,000 acres of the 320,000-acre Ranch. In addition, all wind turbines will be confined to one of two development areas within the Ranch, which are shown on the enclosed map as the Chokecherry Wind Turbine Development Area and the Sierra Madre Wind Turbine Development Area.

Transportation to and from the Project

The likely access points that PCW will use for Project construction and operation are: (1) just south of Sinclair at Interstate Highway 80 Exit 221, the CIG Plant Road (northern access into the Project), and (2) about 17 miles south of Rawlins on State Highway 71/County Road 401 (western and southern access into the Project). These access points are identified on the enclosed map. PCW plans to deliver nearly all project material and components by rail to an unloading facility constructed near the Project's northern access point (near Sinclair and the existing Union Pacific rail line). This will greatly reduce the use of public roads and highways. Any material and components that are not delivered via the existing Union Pacific rail line will be delivered by truck using Interstate Highway 80, Carbon County Road 407 and State Highway 71/County Road 401. Construction workers and employees will also use these public roads to access the Project. These access routes are also depicted on the enclosed map.

Construction and Work Force

Construction of the Project is expected to begin in 2013 and continue through 2017. Construction will be seasonal in nature, occurring largely between April and November. The first period of construction will involve building internal roads and the rail delivery facility. Wind turbines, the internal electrical transmission system, and support facilities will be constructed in the following years. The number of construction workers will fluctuate seasonally throughout the year, and from year to year. Up to 300 to 400 workers are anticipated in each of the first two years of construction, with a peak of 1,200 workers in subsequent years. PCW aims to hire as many qualified local workers as possible.

Economic Benefits

The Project provides important economic benefits to Wyoming. The Project will create thousands of construction jobs and at least 114 permanent, good-paying jobs that will attract skilled workers and their families. The economic benefits of the Project will support existing businesses and new business opportunities across Wyoming. The Project represents a \$4 billion to \$6 billion investment in critical infrastructure. Plus, the Project will provide an estimated \$674 million to \$820 million in total tax revenue over a twenty-year period, all of which stays in Wyoming.

According to the Job and Economic Development Impact Wind Energy Model created by the National Renewable Energy Laboratory, construction of the Project will create more than 12,500 direct and indirect jobs, and subsequent operation of the Project will create more than 500 direct and indirect jobs throughout the value chain. This valuable contribution will improve the economy of the State of Wyoming.

Benefits to Current Land Uses

The Project is compatible with current land uses on the Ranch. The Ranch consists of agricultural lands used for cattle operations and associated crop production. The Project will not materially impair or diminish this use or any other future agricultural use on the Ranch. Operation of the Project also will not diminish any hunting or other recreational opportunities that exist today.

Constructing and operating the Project on the Ranch is also entirely consistent with land uses in the surrounding area. The vast majority of lands surrounding the Project are used for ranching, agriculture and energy generation, mostly involving natural gas extraction and transportation. A number of such energy developments are similar in scale to the Project, and some cover a larger area with road and pad type development. In this respect the Project is right at home in this energy producing region of Wyoming.

Environmental Benefits

The Project will emit no odors or other emissions while in operation and therefore will greatly benefit air quality. The same is true with respect to water quality, as Project operations will not discharge or use a significant amount of water. Nor will the Project impact the water uses of others, because PCW will use water available on the Ranch to supply its construction and operational needs.

In a similar vein, the Project will not adversely affect human health through so-called “wind turbine syndrome.” The scientific literature reports there is little to no evidence for such adverse effects on human health caused by wind farms and the Project is too distant from any population center to present such concerns.

PCW also is developing the Project in a way that avoids, minimizes and mitigates potential impacts to wildlife on the Ranch. PCW is studying how wildlife species use the Ranch lands, is generating real data and is developing science-based conservation measures to address potential impacts. Some studies began nearly four years ago and many are continuing. PCW has also committed to an extraordinary level of cooperation with governmental agencies charged with conserving wildlife. PCW’s efforts in this regard lead the industry and will set precedent and new industry standards. The data and analysis will continue to inform the Project’s layout and design. For example, PCW has committed to no development within core sage-grouse population areas identified by the State of Wyoming under the Governor’s Executive Order 2011-5, and facilities will be micro-sited to minimize impacts to areas heavily used by wildlife. PCW has implemented and will continue to implement conservation measures to benefit potentially affected species. The Ranch’s ample land and water resources allow PCW to flexibly manage multiple priorities – such as conserving and enhancing habitat while also developing the Project and allowing ranching operations to continue.

In addition, PCW is proposing to place over 26,000 acres of Ranch land into a conservation easement where wind energy development will not be permitted. This is a significant mitigation measure and environmental benefit given the size of the proposed easement area and the demand for wind energy development in the immediate area and the region generally.

At the end of the Project's life, PCW will completely and properly decommission the Project and reclaim the affected lands to their original condition. Prior to construction, PCW will post adequate bonding and other financial assurance to stand behind its decommissioning and reclamation obligations.

Following the release of a [Final Environmental Impact Statement](#) from the U.S. Bureau of Land Management in July, PCW is now pursuing a permit from the Wyoming Industrial Siting Division to construct, operate and decommission the proposed wind project.

In connection with this process, the ISD has identified a geographical area called the "study area," which includes local governments in the vicinity of the project (Carbon County, Sweetwater County, Albany County, Natrona County). PCW has scheduled seven additional meetings to provide local governments and the public in the study area with further opportunities to obtain more information about the wind project, ask questions and provide comments for PCW's consideration.

PCW will host two community open houses with a free barbecue dinner in Carbon County on **Sept. 18 in Rawlins** at The Depot, and on **Sept. 19 in Saratoga** at the Platte Valley Community Center. Both events will be 4:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m.

In addition, PCW representatives will be available at the following times and locations:

- 4 p.m. - 7 p.m., Sept. 9, Little Snake River Valley Community Center, Baggs.
- 10 a.m. - 2 p.m., Sept. 10, Medicine Bow Community Hall, Medicine Bow.

- 4 p.m. - 7 p.m., Sept. 24, Homewood Suites, Rock Springs.

The Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project is an approximately 2,500 megawatt (1,000 turbines) wind energy generation facility to be built on a 320,000-acre ranch south of Rawlins and Sinclair and northwest of Saratoga. The ranch is privately owned and operated by The Overland Trail Cattle Company LLC. Because of each wind turbine's compact footprint, the project will permanently use less than 2,000 acres of the 320,000-acre ranch, while generating permanent jobs and other economic benefits for Wyoming. PCW also is developing the project in a responsible way that avoids, minimizes and mitigates potential impacts to wildlife and the environment, including developing a variety of science-based conservation measures and plans.

Since the wind project's inception, the BLM held four [public scoping open houses](#) in August 2008; PCW held two [community open houses with dinner](#) in March 2010; and the BLM held two [Draft EIS open houses](#) in August 2011. PCW representatives also have discussed the project at more than two dozen county, municipal and special district public meetings.
