Terracon Consultants, Inc. (Terracon) has prepared this *Public Participation Plan - FINAL* (PPP) presenting a plan to allow the public to participate in the remedial investigation and remedial design activities proposed at the Crosby 25-3 Natural Gas Well site (Site). This PPP is being prepared as one of the requirements of the Voluntary Remediation Program (VRP) and in response to:

- A letter from the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality (WDEQ) entitled *Request for Public Participation Plan, Voluntary Remediation Program – Crosby 25-3 Well Blowout; Clark, Wyoming* (VRP Site 58.093) dated June 4, 2007
- A letter from the WDEQ entitled *WDEQ Review of Public Participation Plan,, June 22, 2007 – Crosby 25-3 Natural Gas Well Blowout; Clark Wyoming* dated June 27, 2007; and
- A letter from the WDEQ entitled *WDEQ Review of Amended Draft Public Participation Plan, July 2, 2007 - Crosby 25-3 Natural Gas Well Blowout; Clark Wyoming* dated August 20, 2007
- A letter from the WDEQ entitled *WDEQ Review of “Final Draft Public Participation Plan, September 14, 2007” Crosby 25-3 Natural Gas Well Blowout; Clark, Wyoming*

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1.0 SITE BACKGROUND

The Crosby 25-3 Natural Gas Well is located in Section 25, Township 58 North, Range 103 West, east of Park County Road 1AB, near Clark, Park County, Wyoming. The elevation of the drill pad is approximately 5,364 feet.⁶ Line Creek is located approximately 1,250 feet due east of the Crosby 25-3 Natural Gas Well. Line Creek runs approximately northwest to the southeast in the vicinity of the subject site with an estimated gradient of 0.05 feet per foot. Several residences are located in the valley below the Crosby 25-3 site and one is located above the site. The nearest residences to the site are located approximately 2,000 feet north and 1,500 feet southeast of the well. The location of the site is depicted on Figure 1.

The Crosby 25-3 Natural Gas Well is a directionally drilled well with a total vertical depth of 8,038 feet⁵. The first 2,500 feet of the well is nearly vertical with approximately a 100 foot drift to the southeast¹. Below 2,500 feet the well was directionally drilled in an easterly direction and the bottom of the well is located horizontally approximately 1,300 feet east of the well head.¹

Natural gas, petroleum condensate, and drilling fluids were released from the ground adjacent to the Crosby 25-3 Natural Gas Well located along Line Creek, northwest of Clark, Park County, Wyoming. We understand the release occurred over a period of about 58 hours between 11 and 13 August 2006.¹

2.0 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLAN

This PPP was required by the WDEQ after receiving numerous requests from the public requesting that a PPP be developed. In a letter dated June 4, 2007, the WDEQ formally requested the development of this PPP with the following requirements:

A schedule for the site which includes, but is not limited to milestones such as a work plan submittal, field investigation, report on the field investigation, review of remedial options, and implementation of a remedy. The schedule should include a time period for the preparation of each item, review by the WDEQ, review by the public, and finalization of documents.

A commitment to provid[e] the public with the "Unidentified Compound Search List" for all monitoring data collected at the site including groundwater, surface water, soil and sediments.

The location of a central repository(ies) in Park County where all pertinent documents will be kept and which is easily accessible by the public.

A description of how the data will be made available in electronic form to the public.

A designated Windsor contact person who will be readily available to the public and how the contact person will consistently keep the public informed of current progress at the site (i.e. mailings, public meetings, web site, phone calls). The contact person should maintain a current mailing list of all interested parties.

After the completion and distribution of the *Public Participation Plan – Amended Draft* and the *Remedial Investigation Work Plan – Amended Draft* both dated 2 July 2007, and the occurrence of a public meeting on July 10, 2007, numerous comments were received by WDEQ. The public comments generally consisted of concerns related to the request by Windsor access to the “Common Ground” along Line Creek for monitoring well installation, the incomplete list of materials used on the Crosby site, the length of time until remediation would begin, requests for additional geologic and geographic exhibits, and sampling and analysis procedures.

Based upon conversations with WDEQ, it is Terracon’s understanding that comments received would be reviewed by WDEQ and pertinent changes to the drafts would be requested by WDEQ of Terracon and Windsor.

2.1. Specific Objectives

The specific objectives of this PPP are to develop a remedial action necessary at the site that addresses all of the public’s questions and concerns. Through involvement with the public, implementation of the objectives of the PPP will aid in the regulatory process of the remediation site and the surrounding area of Line Creek.

2.2. Implementation

The implementation of the PPP has begun with the distribution of the drafts of the PPP to interested parties and Line Creek Wilderness Subdivision residents. Continued implementation of this PPP has been assured by Windsor. Updated mailing lists are generated regularly when modifications (additions or deletions are requested). The public will be notified of site activities and pertinent document generation.

Public notification materials will be sent out to alert the interested parties and Line Creek Wilderness Subdivision residents of upcoming public notice periods, meetings, and document distribution.

2.3. Public Participation to Date

To date, Windsor and Terracon have completed the obligations for public notice as set forth by WDEQ. The public notice advertisement ran in the Cody Enterprise newspaper for four consecutive weeks, and a letter was sent to all 62 contiguous property owners informing them of the acceptance of the site into the Voluntary Remediation Program (VRP) and their opportunity to request the production of a PPP.

Windsor has pledged that they are committed to the specific objectives and successful implementation of the PPP. Windsor is dedicated to assuring that the public will have sufficient interaction with its employees and that communication with the public will be its top priority. Windsor had provided the public with updates on the site characterization activities, their recognition of the “Common Ground” access as an issue, and their willingness to address the concerns of the WDEQ and public by eagerly modifying their proposals to match the public requests. Windsor is committed to provide the public with access to any documentation or available knowledge generated as part of site characterization activities, including domestic water well sampling.

2.5. Proposed Schedule

The following presents the proposed schedule for work and deliverables between now and the implementation of the remedial alternative. It should be noted that the dates presented herein are approximate and may be modified due to contractor availability, site use, and other factors. Significant changes to the proposed schedule will be communicated to the public through the project website, mailings, and other methods as described previously.

Additionally, it should be noted that the schedule proposed herein assumes that the collection of data as part of the Remedial Investigation will be sufficient to evaluate remedial alternatives. Should additional information and site investigation be required, the schedule would change dramatically. However, Windsor has implemented field screening activities to reduce the possibility that additional characterization will be required. Windsor acknowledges that the provided schedule is dynamic and would be contingent upon the public's agreement and acceptance.

Finally, should the petroleum products released be detected in samples obtained from private drinking water wells, the schedule as proposed will be modified, as urgent response actions would be necessary.

Note:

Shaded entries denote an event in which public comments are accepted.

The general process for report generation and review (not including monitoring reports) includes the following:

1. Windsor and Terracon issue a draft of the document to the WDEQ for review and comment;
2. WDEQ issues their comments to Windsor and Terracon;
3. Windsor and Terracon incorporate the comments received from the WDEQ into an *Amended Draft* document;
4. Windsor and Terracon issue the *Amended Draft* document for public comment to the Interested Parties;
5. A public meeting is scheduled to discuss the *Amended Draft* document;
6. WDEQ receives written comments and those presented at the meeting and issues, evaluates the comments, and presents the comments to Windsor and Terracon;
7. Windsor and Terracon incorporate the comments received from WDEQ into a *Final Draft* document;
8. A public meeting is scheduled to discuss the *Final Draft* document;
9. WDEQ receives written comments prior to the meeting and any comments presented at the meeting; WDEQ will then evaluate the comments and then present the comments to Windsor and Terracon (*Note: The day of the meeting represents the final day for which public comments will be accepted*); and

10. Windsor and Terracon incorporate the comments received from WDEQ into a *Final* document and distribute it to the interested parties and repository

The only process above that requires public notification per Wyoming Statutes is the Remedy Agreement. However, the PPP outlines a procedure where the public will receive notification of documents, meetings and other items pertinent to the site. Per the final PPP, Windsor has committed to notifying the public of all pertinent documents, issues, and activities related to the site.

In addition to the general process as described above, the Remedy Agreement will also require public notification by Windsor as stated in Wyoming Statute 35-11-1604(d):

At a minimum for any eligible site regardless of whether a public participation plan has been required, prior to entering into a remedy agreement, the owner shall give written notice of the proposed remedy agreement to all surface owners of record of land adjacent to the site, and publish notice once per week for four (4) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the site is located. The notice shall be of a form and content prescribed by the department, and shall summarize the proposed remedy agreement, provide a description of the site, provide for a thirty (30) day public comment period after the date of the last publication, and provide an opportunity for an oral hearing. An oral hearing on the proposed remedy agreement shall be held if the department finds sufficient interest. The department may enter into a remedy agreement following the public comment period or any hearing, whichever is later.

2.6. Data Availability

All groundwater, springs, surface water, and private drinking water well data will be provided to the public as part of the regular dissemination of data related to monitoring reports. The following distribution of documents will occur as part of future deliverables:

Condensed electronic versions (when necessary) of the deliverables will be available for download on the WDEQ's website. Windsor Energy has set up a public notification website where full copies of all reports, including laboratory data are available to download. This website is: www.windsorlinecreek.info.

Hardcopies of reports can be made available to interested parties on a case-by-case basis. It should be noted that many of documents are several hundred pages in length and comprised of

several volumes. These large documents may be provided to those requesting them; however, smaller documents will likely be provided without discussion.

Hardcopies of the deliverables will also be made available at Northwest College's Hinckley Library in Powell, Wyoming. Based upon a verbal agreement with the librarian, the documents will be made available for public viewing until the Remedy Agreement has been closed. Terracon will issue an updated index of the publications during each transmittal. After the Remedy Agreement has been closed, the documents being retained will be destroyed, per the Library's policy regarding the federal documents stored in the governmental depository. 2.7. Future Monitoring Reports

All future monitoring reports documenting the sampling of the monitoring wells, springs, surface water, and private drinking water wells will not be made available to the public for comment as

they merely present data collected. They will, however, be made available for public review as discussed subsequently.

3.0 COMMON GROUND ACCESS DISCUSSION

The WDEQ issued a memorandum entitled *Memorandum - Landowner Responsibility for Groundwater Contamination - Windsor Energy Group, LLC, Crosby Well 25-3 Blowout* dated 5 April 2007 to the Clark Resource Council and Line Creek Subdivision Residents. The memorandum discussed WDEQ's position on allowing Windsor to access the "Common Ground" in the subdivision for the purpose of installing and sampling monitoring wells and potential liabilities should impacts be discovered. Here are some excerpts from the letter:

...innocent landowners and would not be liable for investigation, monitoring, remediation or other response actions for contamination associated with oil and gas activities, if found in a groundwater monitoring well on-site.

To be eligible for the immunity, the innocent owner must grant the department reasonable access to the land for investigation, monitoring, or remediation; not use the real property in a manner that causes exposure of the public to harmful environmental conditions; and comply with any applicable engineering or institutional controls

If a groundwater monitoring well located on the Line Creek common ground detects contamination which is not attributable to oil and gas related activities, then it is the WDEQ's responsibility to investigate potential sources of the contamination. Potential sources could include both on-site and off-site sources.

Numerous comments and questions regarding this issue were provided to WDEQ as part of the public comments received for the *Public Participation Plan – Amended Draft* and the *Remedial Investigation Work Plan – Amended Draft*. Based upon discussions with their external legal counsel, Windsor sent a letter entitled *Request for Access to Install Groundwater Monitoring Wells* dated 27 August 2007 to all the owners of the "Common Ground" seeking permission to access the "Common Ground." Here are some excerpts from that letter:

We are asking for your written permission, as a co-owner in the subdivision (based on county records), to drill and operate the monitoring wells and conduct cleanup or remediation activities, as approved by DEQ, at our sole expense, on the subdivision's common ground.

Our attorneys have informed us that a key requirement to receive protection as an innocent landowner under Wyoming law from liability for investigation, monitoring, remediation or other response action required to cleanup a release, is a grant by you to the DEQ of reasonable access to investigate, monitor, or remediate the release. (Wyo. Stat. § 35-11-1802). If you have concerns, we encourage you to confirm this opinion with your own Wyoming attorney.

Windsor and the WDEQ are in the process of evaluating the Line Creek Wilderness Subdivision responses and Protective Covenants in an attempt to access the “Common Ground” for monitoring and potential remedial activities. The public will be notified of any and all decisions made on this topic by both the WDEQ and Windsor. Furthermore, these actions are in no way limiting the Line Creek Subdivision property owners’ rights to seek outside legal counsel and opinions on this matter.

4.0 CLOSURE

Windsor acknowledges that the PPP must remain flexible and open for revisions in order to maximize it’s effectiveness at achieving the objectives and commitments stated herein.

Windsor maintains a consistent commitment to the ongoing effort of remediation and will preserve open lines of communication with the Clark community in helping to improve success of any corrective action taken at the site. These open lines include an invitation to contact Mr. Dan Johnson regarding any concerns, or to continue to communicate with Windsor’s subcontractor Terracon.
