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Transcript of Hearing Proceedings in the above-entitled matter before the Water and Waste Advisory Board, commencing on the 11th day of December 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission Building Hearing Room, 2211 King Boulevard, Casper, Wyoming, Mr. Bill Welles presiding via teleconference with board members Marjorie Bedessem and Lorie Cahn. Present in Casper were board member Mr. David Applegate and Mr. Mike Jennings.

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P R O C E E D I N G S

(Hearing proceedings commenced 9:30 a.m.,
December 11, 2009.)

MR. JENNINGS: I thought, just like in the past, we'd just basically go through, just have it kind of agenda-driven. And I might be a little slower today because we've got so many of them that I had to send three separate packets to you. So I might have to do a little shuffling around, trying to find things. So please bear with me.

But at any rate, just to let you know, Dave's here. I'm here. We've got a couple folks in the audience. And Randy, our transcriptionist, is here. I'm also having an audio recording made of it in case, for some reason, we need that. But I guess I'll just -- and, Marge, you're really good at this. When I forget to advance the agenda on the computer there, just let me know --

MS. BEDESSEM: Okay. I'll holler at you.

MR. JENNINGS: -- and I'll move it ahead.
At any rate, I guess we'll just -- as in the past, we'll start with the full reimbursement recommendations.

MS. CAHN: Mike, before we go on -- this is Lorie.

MR. JENNINGS: Yes.

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MS. CAHN: I just have a request. I'd

2 like to just announce to the people there in the audience
3 and make sure that they know that the Water Quality
4 Division portion of this meeting -- I mean, the Hazardous
5 and Solids -- the other portion of this meeting has been
6 postponed or cancelled. Just make sure there's not
7 people in the audience that are waiting for the other
8 part of the meeting that we were originally supposed to
9 have.

10 MR. JENNINGS: Yeah. Thank you for that
11 reminder. I've been -- don't have that many folks here.
12 I've been trying to let them know -- actually, trying to
13 make sure that they're here for me and not for the other
14 one. And yeah, there was a feller here earlier for the
15 other meeting. But the folks who are present right now
16 are here to kind of listen to us.

17 MS. CAHN: Okay. Thanks.

18 MR. JENNINGS: Okay. And thank you.
19 Basically, starting off, then, looking at the
20 agenda -- by the way, is everybody who's on, does
21 everybody have the Live Meeting hookup, and can they see
22 the agenda?

23 MR. CAHN: Yes.

24 CHAIRMAN WELLES: No, I do not.

25 MS. BEDESSEM: I don't see the agenda. I
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1 see the first page of the full reimbursement. Oh, I
2 guess that is the agenda.

3 MR. JENNINGS: Yeah.

4 MS. BEDESSEM: I see A, B and C on the
5 front.

6 MR. JENNINGS: Yep. Yep, that's it.
7 Okay. And basically, just real quickly, on all of those
8 particular ones -- and that goes into page 2 and the
9 upper portion of page 3. I'll just kind of -- I'll name
10 them off here as we go.

11 We've got Town of Wheatland. And this is for
12 Step 1 work plan development. We've got Manderson for
13 work plan development. We've got Teton County with the
14 Horsethief Canyon Landfill, Step 1 work plan development,
15 Sundance, City of Sundance, the old Sundance dump work
16 plan development, Town of Lingle work plan development,
17 City of Laramie work plan development and field work,
18 Town of Wheatland field work, and the last of the full
19 reimbursement recommendations is Town of Burns, and
20 that's for first quarter sampling and analysis.

21 MS. CAHN: I move that we approve full
22 reimbursements -- now, Teton County, Horsethief, is
23 Marge -- does Marge need --

24 MS. BEDESSEM: Wheatland and Teton County,
25 Horsethief are both facilities that I would abstain from.
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1 I can vote on the others, except I don't know about the
2 list that I gave -- gave Mike.

3 MS. CAHN: Well, there's three of us here.

4 Do we want to just have the three of us vote?
5 MS. BEDESSEM: You can do that.
6 MS. CAHN: I mean, unless anybody has any
7 comments on the full reimbursement, maybe the three of
8 us -- Marge can just abstain because we have --
9 MS. BEDESSEM: Right.
10 MS. CAHN: We don't know.
11 MS. BEDESSEM: Uh-huh. Just go ahead and
12 do that for this group, I would suggest.
13 MS. CAHN: So I move that we approve full
14 reimbursement as recommended for the list that Mike just
15 read off there.
16 MR. APPLGATE: I second.
17 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Any other questions?
18 (No response.)
19 CHAIRMAN WELLES: All those in favor vote
20 aye.
21 MS. CAHN: Aye.
22 MR. APPLGATE: Aye.
23 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Aye.
24 MS. BEDESSEM: And I abstain.
25 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Opposed?

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1 (No response.)
2 CHAIRMAN WELLES: We have one abstention.
3 Other than that, it passes.
4 MR. JENNINGS: Thank you. I'm just busy
5 taking my copy and noting in the box that says same for
6 the Water and Waste Advisory Board and just mark that on
7 there real quick.
8 CHAIRMAN WELLES: I have one question,
9 Mike.
10 MR. JENNINGS: Yes.
11 CHAIRMAN WELLES: On my revised agenda,
12 it's revised 11/27/09.
13 MR. JENNINGS: And thank you for bringing
14 that up. You need the one -- and I apologize. You need
15 the one that's dated December 3rd of '09. It should have
16 been the last one you got. And I believe it came with
17 the -- I think it was with the Lingle application.
18 MS. CAHN: It came with Hulett. Right?
19 MR. JENNINGS: Or, Hulett. Excuse me. It
20 was with Hulett, yes.
21 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Okay. I didn't get that
22 one.
23 MR. JENNINGS: Oh, shoot.
24 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Oh, I do have the Hulett
25 one. Okay.

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1 MR. JENNINGS: And as per your
2 instructions previously, it's got a -- right underneath
3 the header, it will say revised 12/3/09.
4 MS. BEDESSEM: That was perfect. That
5 made it much easier to sort the applications with the new

6 agenda. Thank you.
7 MR. JENNINGS: You bet.
8 CHAIRMAN WELLES: I'm not finding that
9 document. Hang on. Okay. Now I've got it.
10 MS. BEDESSEM: It also -- I just wanted to
11 say I appreciate having on the agenda, you know, kind of
12 the summary on there, as well. Particularly, it helps
13 with sorting the applications when you have one
14 application that is in two different spots on the agenda
15 because they're combined.
16 MR. JENNINGS: Yeah. It can be very
17 confusing for me. And I figure, well, if it's confusing
18 for me, you're probably at a pretty serious disadvantage
19 on that. But there's always room for improvement. So if
20 you'd like something else on these, let me know. I'll do
21 what I can.
22 MS. BEDESSEM: I thought it was good.
23 MR. JENNINGS: Okay. Great.
24 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Let's move on to the
25 partial reimbursements.
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1 MR. JENNINGS: Okay. I'm going to scroll
2 on down here.
3 MS. CAHN: On this one, we know Marge is
4 going to abstain from Horsethief.
5 MR. JENNINGS: Okay. Well, we've got --
6 under partial reimbursement, the first one I've got on
7 the list is Salt Creek Joint Powers Board. This is going
8 to be Midwest, Edgerton Number 1 and Number 2. And this
9 is for work plan and field work. And basically, the
10 deductions on that were due to ineligible downtime by the
11 driller. And there was also a double charge on travel.
12 Any comments from anyone?
13 MS. BEDESSEM: Seems pretty
14 straightforward.
15 MS. CAHN: Do we want to just vote on that
16 one while we're on it?
17 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Or do we want to go
18 through all of them like we have in the past?
19 MR. JENNINGS: I guess, maybe, Bill, if
20 there are some particular ones that board members may
21 have some questions or concerns about, we could pull
22 those out now. If not, we could just do the whole thing.
23 Just whatever you folks would like.
24 MS. CAHN: Yeah. I do have a question on
25 Town of Hulett. This is Lorie.
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1 MR. JENNINGS: Is it on the balance of the
2 rest of them, though? Is this something we could maybe
3 just dispense with in one fell swoop, or what do you
4 folks think?
5 MS. CAHN: I don't have any questions on
6 the remainder of them.
7 MR. JENNINGS: And actually, I have one

8 audience participant representing Natrona County. And
9 let me just ask Margaret if she has any questions or
10 concerns about hers. If not, then maybe we can do this.
11 So hang on just a second.

12 Okay. And we have one other representative
13 from the Midwest Assistance Program, Michael. And I
14 don't know if Michael has any questions on any of this,
15 but let me ask him real quick.

16 And Michael doesn't have anything at this
17 point, either. So, again, I guess back to you, Bill,
18 however you want to handle this.

19 CHAIRMAN WELLES: I don't see why we can't
20 go through all of them and vote at once. Marge has got
21 to abstain. Maybe we should do those in two separate --
22 two separate votes, I guess.

23 MS. BEDESSEM: Yeah. I think the only one
24 out of this pack -- oh, no. There's Baggs, as well,
25 Baggs and Teton County.

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1 MS. CAHN: Does anybody have any questions
2 on any of them except for Hulett?

3 MR. APPLGATE: This is Dave. I don't.

4 CHAIRMAN WELLES: I do not.

5 MS. CAHN: Then I move we vote on all of
6 them except Hulett and Baggs. Are there any other,
7 Marge, that you don't --

8 MS. BEDESSEM: Teton County and Wheatland,
9 both of those, as well.

10 MS. CAHN: So I vote that we -- I move
11 that we vote on all of them except those, Baggs, Teton
12 County -- Marge, help me out.

13 MS. BEDESSEM: Wheatland.

14 MS. CAHN: Wheatland.

15 MR. JENNINGS: And Hulett, I assume?

16 MS. CAHN: Hulett, yes.

17 MS. BEDESSEM: I second that motion.

18 CHAIRMAN WELLES: All those in favor say
19 aye.

20 (All members vote aye.)

21 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Opposed?

22 (No response.)

23 CHAIRMAN WELLES: None opposed. Motion
24 carries.

25 MR. APPLGATE: Now should we do the

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1 motion on the ones other than Hulett?

2 MS. CAHN: Yeah.

3 MR. APPLGATE: So I move that we approve
4 the Baggs, Teton County and Wheatland as outlined in the
5 agenda.

6 MS. CAHN: I second.

7 CHAIRMAN WELLES: All those in favor say
8 aye.

9 MS. CAHN: Aye.

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MR. APPELEGATE: Aye.

CHAIRMAN WELLES: Aye.

MS. BEDESSEM: And I abstain.

CHAIRMAN WELLES: Opposed?

(No response.)

CHAIRMAN WELLES: Motion carries.

MR. JENNINGS: Okay. I'm getting those marked off real quick, and then we can address Hulett here in just a second. Okay, back to Hulett.

MS. CAHN: Mike, and I just have a question on the documentation provided and the notes that you provided us. It was very helpful.

MR. JENNINGS: I've got it right in front of me, so fire away.

MS. CAHN: Okay. And that was why we are being requested to reimburse something that has not been

1 billed for yet.

2 MR. JENNINGS: Well, okay. I was thinking
3 in terms of cutting down on paperwork. I got
4 notification from -- and it's a good point. And you can
5 certainly pull it out if you want. My thought behind
6 that was, I found an accounting error from the
7 consultant. And when this -- when they found out about
8 that, they were -- they assured me, yes, they absolutely
9 were going to bill for that. And I got an e-mail, and I
10 filed it away.

11 And I thought, taking the high road on this,
12 that, indeed, they were going to process that, that it
13 would cut down on having to do another application, more
14 time and effort, potentially, on the municipality to
15 submit for that. And I thought it might be appropriate
16 just to -- it's making an assumption, and I admit that.
17 But because we also eliminated the need for proof of
18 payment, I thought, well, based on that, maybe this would
19 be an appropriate response. But if it's not, that's
20 certainly fine. But I'll kind of leave it up to you.

21 MS. CAHN: In essence -- because it's
22 shown on the invoice. So, in essence, they were
23 billed -- the bill, we already have in our packet. It's
24 just that they forgot to include it in what they were
25 asking for reimbursement for. Is that correct?

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1 MR. JENNINGS: Exactly. If you look at
2 the very bottom of that one piece of documentation -- in
3 fact, let me --

4 MS. CAHN: The bottom three numbers are
5 all for survey.

6 MR. JENNINGS: Exactly. And that's why I
7 said inadvertently left out by consultants. Will be
8 billed later with survey subcontractor bills. It would
9 include that with that.

10 MS. CAHN: We do have their bill or
11 accounting. Okay.

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MR. JENNINGS: Yeah.

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MS. CAHN: It's just that they forgot the reimbursement. They didn't include that amount?

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MR. JENNINGS: It wasn't that the Town forgot. The contractor, when they added it all up, they inadvertently left out the bottom three numbers.

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MS. CAHN: Okay. Well, since we can see what it is that they will be billing for, I don't have a problem with it. It was unclear to me what was going on. So I don't have a problem with it this way.

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CHAIRMAN WELLES: I think that's a good -- I'm glad you brought that up, because it's a good explanation that Mike gave us, and it will save further, you know, work in another application, et cetera, et

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cetera. So I think it's -- thank you for clarifying that.

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MR. JENNINGS: Well, and thank you so much. And again, please, if you run across something like that in advance, if you're scratching your head, give me a call. Be more than happy to -- I do the best I can with these things, but I realize it can be very confusing. But if you'd like, just give me a call in advance. And if that will help put you at ease or firm up your decision one way or another, I'd be more than happy to do that for you.

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MS. CAHN: I think you've really got this down to a science. These packets are great. It's really easy. You do a lot of the hard work for us, and we appreciate it.

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MR. JENNINGS: Well, thank you. I appreciate -- appreciate your remarks.

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(No response.)
CHAIRMAN WELLES: Hearing none, motion passes for the Town of Hulett.

MR. JENNINGS: Okay. Last thing we have, then, is just a quick-and-dirty program update. I'll scroll to that.

Okay. You can probably -- for those of you that have the computer monitors, a little over \$127,000 -- and that does not count today, by the way. But a little over \$127,000 has been put out for work plan grants, about one -- almost 1.4 million in the Step 2 field investigation grants, a little over -- almost \$56,000 in sampling and analysis grants have been put out

14 to date. So we've got just short of \$6.4 million left
15 over.

16 And as far as work completion status -- oh, and
17 I did want to note that -- as a new thing, I just wanted
18 to let you know, at least the totals that were in the
19 application today is just a little over 350 -- about
20 \$352,000, give or take. As far as completion status,
21 again, out of the 105 that we sent letters to -- or,
22 excuse me. Out of 115, we got 105. So we got 91.3
23 percent of that. 98 of that 105 have come in. So that's
24 93 percent. Approval of that 98 is 96 of them. So we're
25 at 91.4 percent. We've received 77 drilling reports. So

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1 we've almost got three-quarters of those in. And 61 of
2 the 77 have been approved.

3 And just to let you know, there is some
4 iterative work going on, where we've had some issues with
5 some well and/or the number of wells. And again, what I
6 typically do with those, in my spread sheet, they go as
7 supplemental activities. And we do have some of that
8 work coming up.

9 Just to let you know, as far as the report is
10 concerned, I'm working with the GIS people down in
11 Cheyenne. And we've also got our -- we've got some
12 database guru down there, Dave Lynn, who is very good at
13 this. And, in fact, I'll be meeting with him next week.
14 We're setting up protocols as far as how we make
15 decisions on what is impacted and what is not impacted.
16 And we hope to have the report. Our thoughts at this
17 point is it may be -- we may have some GIS input on that,
18 which I think would be pretty cool and kind of a neat
19 little database that they're putting together. But
20 that's starting to come together on that. And we're --
21 of course, time is starting to grow short on that. But
22 we hope to have some significant progress on that fairly
23 soon.

24 So that's kind of where we're at with this
25 stuff. Anybody have any questions?

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1 MS. BEDESSEM: I guess when I'm looking at
2 these totals, I see -- under work completion, the
3 percentages look pretty good, but yet as far as how much
4 reimbursement money has been spent, it's a small amount
5 of the total.

6 MR. JENNINGS: Yeah.

7 MS. BEDESSEM: So is it because
8 reimbursement requests haven't come in?

9 MR. JENNINGS: There are still a number of
10 them pending out there. I don't know how many. I think
11 a lot of the -- a lot of the cost estimates that came in,
12 it's my opinion a lot of them were basically high-balled
13 just in case they ran across problems. And I suspect
14 that may have also gone into some of the original figures
15 as far as what it might cost for this. And it seems like

16 a lot of the work is coming in less so. There's still
17 plenty of work out there.

18 You'll notice there's a fairly small figure on
19 the sampling and analysis stuff. And that's -- there's
20 kind of two reasons for that. First of all, there are a
21 lot of facilities that simply aren't eligible for that.
22 If they did not close -- cease receipt of waste prior to
23 September 13th of '89, they're not eligible for that. So
24 that takes out a big chunk of the facilities.

25 Additionally, a lot of them have been -- I
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1 think they're kind of putting it all together and going
2 to submit it as one application. We've allowed people to
3 do it on a quarterly basis if their budget's being in
4 consideration on that. And so I'm thinking there's still
5 a fair number of sampling and analysis stuff out there.
6 Still got plenty of field investigation stuff coming in.
7 And frankly, there are some facilities that just flat
8 haven't applied yet.

9 MS. BEDESSEM: Okay.

10 MR. JENNINGS: But like I said, those are
11 the numbers today. If you want me to put them together
12 in some other fashion to give you some additional
13 information, give me some thoughts or ideas, and I'll
14 give it a shot.

15 MS. BEDESSEM: Well, I think with your
16 additional explanation, that certainly helped.

17 MR. JENNINGS: Okay. Is there anything
18 else by anybody else?

19 CHAIRMAN WELLES: The only thing I would
20 say is that either -- probably after this conference
21 call, why don't you call me, and we'll walk through the
22 actual --

23 MR. JENNINGS: As far as the sign-off on
24 the sheets? Is that what you're talking about, Bill?

25 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Yeah.

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1 MR. JENNINGS: Yeah.

2 CHAIRMAN WELLES: So we don't make a
3 mistake like we did last time.

4 MR. JENNINGS: That would be fine. And
5 one last thing I would like to mention, we're still kind
6 of experimenting with this video technology stuff. And
7 Bob and I spent a great deal of time yesterday working on
8 a sound system so that maybe we wouldn't have to use the
9 UW meet-me call. But I wanted to ask everybody, do -- at
10 least those of you who have laptops or desktops, I'm
11 assuming the vast majority of you have internal
12 microphones, that the potential exists that we might be
13 able to do this through the speaker systems on your
14 computer.

15 And to that end, what I thought I might do,
16 instead of gambling this at a meeting, I thought about
17 maybe setting up a quick-and-dirty test meeting to try

18 that out. And I was just wondering if the board might
19 not be amenable to allowing me to test that with them for
20 maybe ten minutes sometime here in the future.

21 MS. BEDESSEM: Mike, to be honest, I
22 prefer being able to call in.

23 MR. JENNINGS: Okay.

24 MS. BEDESSEM: And the reason that is is
25 because then I don't have to book a conference room, so

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1 that -- in other words, if it's on a speaker on my
2 computer, then anyone in the room hears that.

3 MR. JENNINGS: Point well taken.

4 MS. BEDESSEM: Okay. And so if I'm just
5 here on my computer, it's easier for me to be on the
6 telephone.

7 MR. JENNINGS: Okay. Well, that's fine.
8 I will -- unless I can come up with something that would
9 help with that situation, I'll just dispense with that
10 idea. But, no, thank you. Point well taken.

11 MS. CAHN: The only other option that way
12 would be to just have one of those --

13 MR. JENNINGS: You'd have to have a
14 headset or something like that.

15 MS. BEDESSEM: I don't have a headset,
16 but --

17 MS. CAHN: And then everybody can still
18 hear what you're saying, anyway. They just can't hear
19 the other side.

20 CHAIRMAN WELLES: I have a rather
21 antiquated desk computer here at the office, and so it
22 doesn't work for me, either.

23 MR. JENNINGS: Okay. Well, at any rate,
24 well, okay, it was worth a shot. But, no, I -- like I
25 say, that's why I ask these questions, to figure out what

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1 problems might be out there. And like I say, that's
2 fine. We'll just keep on keeping on with this. But I
3 appreciate you folks working with me on this. And I
4 apologize if there were a few bugaboos at the beginning
5 of this one. But like I say, it's a work in progress,
6 and I'm getting better at it.

7 MS. CAHN: A helpful thing for me would
8 be, since I've got a computer that has a microphone and
9 all that stuff, but when I click into the meetings on the
10 e-mail -- and I can't -- couldn't do any sound, I guess
11 because you weren't doing it that way. It would be nice
12 to have in your e-mails a phone number that we call for
13 the UW meeting on the one that invites us into the --

14 MS. BEDESSEM: Right. So we don't have to
15 look through the two separate e-mails to find what number
16 to call.

17 MR. JENNINGS: That's an excellent point.
18 I can just simply insert that into the -- because I
19 can -- you know, I can put a little header information on

20 the e-mail for the Live Meeting. So if I included that
21 in there, then, that sounds like that would be very
22 helpful, then.

23 MS. CAHN: Yeah, it would be.

24 MR. JENNINGS: Good point. All right.

25 MS. CAHN: And then I think if you aren't

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1 planning on having -- since we're not going to have sound
2 as part of the Live Meetings, then just go ahead and put
3 that in the e-mail, as well. Because I spent a bunch of
4 time trying to figure out what was wrong, why I wasn't
5 getting sound, since I'm all set up for it. And so that
6 would save me some time if I knew I wasn't trying to get
7 something I couldn't get.

8 MR. JENNINGS: Excellent point. All
9 right. I will attempt to do so.

10 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Mike, if you can bear
11 with us for just a second, I'd like to communicate with
12 the rest of the board about the Coal Bed Methane Produced
13 Water Working Group.

14 MR. JENNINGS: Okey-doke. Fine.

15 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Just so all of you know,
16 I did go to the meeting that was in Gillette on December
17 2nd. I did not participate. There wasn't time at the
18 end of the meeting for public comments. And I decided it
19 was -- because of my position with the Water and Waste
20 Advisory Board, I should not comment. But I'm awfully
21 glad that I went. It was an interesting process. They
22 put together a lot of people. And they're using the
23 Ruckelshaus Institute as sort of the moderator to do a
24 negotiation to achieve collaborative outcomes.

25 And I guess after the first meeting, my comment

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1 is, good luck. It really hasn't changed much. And until
2 and unless they can figure out how they're going to get
3 some sort of consensus, I don't know where it's going to
4 end up. They planned another meeting for January 7th and
5 then another meeting for February 1st, which I'll try and
6 go to both of them. I think they're going to be in
7 Casper.

8 But, anyway, I'm going to continue to go to
9 those and just listen and see where it goes. But
10 basically, it's the same old people that have been doing
11 it for ten years, and they've never reached consensus
12 yet, so I can't really see how they're going to do it
13 now.

14 MS. BEDESSEM: How long did this meeting
15 last, Bill?

16 CHAIRMAN WELLES: It was pretty much all
17 day. And, of course, they had to go through the -- you
18 know, being the first meeting, there was a lot of sort of
19 explanation and setup and introductions of all the people
20 who were there and so on and so forth. I really honestly
21 believe that, you know, they're trying to do something in

22 a manner that I really doubt is going to produce results.
23 But I will reserve my judgment and continue to go and see
24 where it goes.

25 MS. BEDESSEM: Thank you, Bill.

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1 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Is there anything else
2 before the board at this point?

3 MS. CAHN: I'm just curious if we know yet
4 when the (unintelligible) meeting is going to happen
5 again.

6 CHAIRMAN WELLES: No, we don't. I suspect
7 it won't be until at least January, from what John Wagner
8 said, because they have to go through the whole public
9 comment process again, because they had a conflicting set
10 of documentation.

11 MS. CAHN: Okay.

12 MS. BEDESSEM: I guess we'll just wait to
13 hear.

14 MR. JENNINGS: Well, Bill, if you want
15 to -- if you folks are pretty much concluded, if you want
16 to hang on the phone after we're done, and then, yeah,
17 I'll just go through the cost spread sheets with you so
18 we can get those squared away.

19 CHAIRMAN WELLES: Okay.
