8. Attachments:

For all projects:

- A **complete map as described in the permit's SWPPP requirements** must be submitted with the NOI for **all** facilities. A hard copy with this NOI **OR** (*Preferred*) electronically (as PDF or Microsoft Word compatible format) on a CD or DVD with the NOI or to deq-stormwater@wyo.gov. Maps submitted by e-mail must include the permittee name and contact information and the project name and location.
- A **map of access routes** to the project that comply with the access requirements as defined in item 3 above.
- A **check for permit fees must be attached**. To determine the fee amount required for this application go to the fee calculator at http://deq.state.wy.us/wqd/WYPDES_Permittting/feecalc.html. Checks should be made payable to the Department of Environmental Quality.
